Texas ranks No.1 for having the worst drivers

EL PASO, Texas (KTSM) — Texas was ranked number one when it came to having the "worst drivers" among all 50 states, according to a report from Forbes Advisor.

The report compares all 50 states and Washington D.C. across six key metrics to determine which state has the worst drivers.

Those six metrics are the following:

- Number of drunk drivers involved in fatal car accidents per 100,000 licensed drivers
- Number of fatal car accidents involving a distracted driver per 100,000 licensed drivers
- Number of fatal car accidents involving a drowsy driver per 100,000 licensed drivers
- Number of fatal car accidents involving a driver who was driving the wrong way on a one-way street or on the wrong side of the road per 100,000 licensed driver
- Number of fatal car accidents involving a driver who failed to obey traffic signs, traffic signals or a traffic officer per 100,000 licensed drivers
- Number of drivers who looked at a phone per mile

WHAT AMERICAN CITY HAS THE HIGHEST RATE OF FATAL DRUNK DRIVING CRASHES?

- THE CITY WITH THE MOST DRUNK DRIVING CRASHES PER CAPITA IS ODESSA, TEXAS.
 - BETWEEN 2018 AND 2022, THERE WERE A TOTAL OF 31 DRUNK DRIVING CRASHES THAT RESULTED IN FATALITIES, AMOUNTING TO A RATE OF 27.46 FATAL DRUNK DRIVING CRASHES PER 100,000 RESIDENTS.
- OF THE 31 DRUNK DRIVING CRASHES, 23 WERE CAUSED BY IMPAIRED DRIVERS WITH A BLOOD ALCOHOL CONTENT OF 0.15% OR HIGHER
- IN <u>FEBRUARY 2024</u>, OVER JUST 4 DAYS, LAW ENFORCEMENT IN ODESSA ARRESTED AND CHARGED 20 PEOPLE WITH IMPAIRED DRIVING. A STUDY ALSO FOUND THAT <u>TEXAS HAS THE MOST</u> DRUNK DRIVERS INVOLVED IN FATAL CAR CRASHES, WITH MORE THAN 40% OF THE DRIVERS FOUND TO HAVE A BAC LEVEL OF 0.08 OR HIGHER.

Driving in West Texas is deadly dangerous. A new report measures how much.

A nonprofit commissioned the report that found severe and fatal vehicle crashes in the Permian Basin far outpaced the state.

PERMIAN BASIN CRASHES ARE TWICE AS LIKELY TO BE FATAL COMPARED TO THE REST OF THE STATE The difference between the rate of severe and fatal crashes in West Texas compared to the rest of the state is striking. Nearly 15 crashes per 1,000 resulted in at least one death in the Permian Basin. During the same time period, the statewide average for the same type of crashes was seven per 1,000.

Put another way, crashes were twice as likely to be fatal in the Permian Basin than in the rest of Texas. More than half of the incidents involved multiple vehicles, with the rate of fatalities of multi-vehicle collisions being three times higher.

The report tracked 962 crashes in the Permian that resulted in at least one death during the five-year period. That's about one fatal crash every other day. Nearly half of those accidents happened within Midland and Ector counties, the two most populated in the region. A combined 329,000 people live in those counties, which include the cities of Midland and Odessa.






